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Behaviour Expectation and Classroom Management Policy

Founded by the Sisters of Charity in 1902, Catholic Ladies' College (CLC) is a Christ-centred community established to educate, in partnership with parents, women of faith, integrity, individuality and compassion, confident of their own worth as women and wholly involved in the transformation of society. We are a welcoming, robust and inclusive community, which seeks to value and appreciate excellence and justice, compassion and collaboration, diversity and individuality.

Purpose

As a community this College works for the good of all when members of the community accept responsibility for their conduct and are aware of the effect their conduct may have on others.

It is therefore the responsibility of all – college leadership, staff, students and parents – to support behaviours that are conducive to the development of students and to their learning.

Student behaviour management at Catholic Ladies' College seeks to protect personal and school community safety, heal destructive behaviours, restore relationships, encourage reconciliation, enhance wellbeing, foster responsibility, enable personal growth, and promote the common good.

Guiding Principles

- All at the College can expect to be treated with respect and courtesy
- Responsible behaviour is conducive to developing a safe, secure and productive learning environment
- Clear, timely and accurate communication among staff, students and parents reinforces responsible behaviours
- It is important that encouragement of good behaviour and follow up to unsatisfactory behaviour is undertaken in a transparent and consistent manner
- At all times students are to be encouraged to accept the responsibility for their behaviour – both in formal classes and at times when they are working independently or representing the College in the broader community
- Corporal punishment is not permitted at the College.
- Specific requirements of students [e.g. appropriate wearing of the College Uniform] will be communicated to them at appropriate times and made available to parents so that they in turn can support the College in promoting positive behaviours.
